Specialized Nursing Program for Family Practice/Primary Care Registered Nurses at George Brown College

Are you, or is someone you know, a Registered Nurse (RN) currently practicing or aspiring to practice in a Primary Care setting? If so, you will be interested to know that George Brown College has a new Family Practice/Primary Care nursing certificate program for RNs. This new two-semester, predominantly online program, is aligned with federal and provincial governments' goals for establishing high performance health care teams across the country, ensuring all professionals practice to their full scope within a collaborative practice model to achieve more efficient and effective client-centred primary care.

Current evidence points to the benefits of collaborative team work in terms of client outcomes and job satisfaction. You will have the opportunity to learn about and from other professionals and practice the skills of an intercollaborative team approach within an interprofessional team-based clinical environment. You will explore and analyze the workings of our health-care system, develop competencies related to health promotion, primary prevention and chronic disease management, and apply best practices related to quality management and e-health.

With a postgraduate certificate in Family Practice/Primary Care Nursing you will be able to:

1. Appraise the role and scope of the Registered Nurse in Primary Care.
2. Integrate appropriate and relevant theories, concepts and frameworks into collaborative client-centred practice.
3. Promote and maintain health, and manage acute/chronic disease across the lifespan, within a collaborative client centered Primary Care setting.
4. Critically analyze and apply research to promote best practices for both nursing and health team interventions within a Primary Care setting.
5. Advocate for clients and the health-care system as a member of the health care team.
6. Apply Program Planning and Evaluation, and Quality Management principles to improve outcomes for clients and the health-care delivery system.

OUR PROGRAM

- Two-semester intensive program
- Students interact within a technology-rich environment, courses are predominantly online
- Students are required to come to the College 2 weekends (2 days in late August and 2 days in early December) in first semester for clinical skills labs and testing
- Clinical placement consists of 192 hours in a primary care setting in second semester. Placement site is negotiated with Faculty in compliance with course objectives

The Family Practice/Primary Care Nursing certificate program will enhance the practice competencies of the primary care RN to provide comprehensive care to individuals and families across the lifespan within family health team/primary care contexts and settings. Current research and relevant theoretical perspectives provide the foundation of study for interprofessional family-centred care. The theory and clinical courses build on entry-to-practice nursing competencies and are focused on family practice and primary care specialty areas. Application of theoretical knowledge and skills is gained by providing care to individuals and families in a family health team or other primary care setting where members work together to provide efficient and effective team-based care. Students interact within a technology-rich environment, participating in online discussions with classmates, collaborating on research projects, and engaging in ongoing reflective practice exercises as part of their educational experience.

The knowledge and skills gained through this program will help ensure that RNs have the competencies needed to practice to full scope and participate fully as contributing members of interprofessional intercollaborative family health/primary care teams across Ontario and Canada.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The applicant is a Registered Nurse (RN) currently practicing or aspiring to practice (e.g. new graduate, novice nurse) in Primary Care. The applicant is currently registered or is eligible for Registered Nurse Annual Registration from an approved College or Nursing Association.

Applicants are required to have current CPR certification and current background police check.
